

Meeting Summary for March 2016 LCS Foundation

The following summary was submitted to the LCS Board of Directors May meeting by LCS Foundation Board President Danielle McCormick:

The April 26, 2016 Foundation Meeting was cancelled due to lack of business. The next Foundation meeting is scheduled for May 20, 2016.

On April 29, 2016, Foundation President Danielle McCormick met with LCS Principal Ian Stout and Foundation Board Liaison Jennifer Thayer to discuss the Foundation and its plans and needs for the next school year.

To honor and thank LCS' amazing staff, the Foundation provided a coffee/smoothie cart for LCS staff at both sites for teacher appreciation week.

The 2nd Annual LCS Golf Tournament is ramping up and is scheduled for Saturday, August 27th at Marianna Butte golf course. A number of teams have already signed up to participate. A recap and results of the Benefit Auction was submitted to the May Parent Pride newsletter. The following summary is a synopsis of that submission:

- The format of the event was changed based on feedback the Foundation received throughout the last several years from parents to make it more family friendly. In doing so, the focus was shifted from an adults-only fundraising event to both a fundraising and, more importantly, a community-building event for the entire LCS K-12 community.
- More than 100 silent auction items were donated from local community partners.
- The Student Art auction was included again this year with amazing submissions by our high school students.
- New this year was a competition between two teachers to see who would get a pie in the face. Mr. Rolph was the "gracious" winner and was awarded at the end of the night by an LCS student whose name was drawn for the honor.
- Also new this year was the inclusion of school clubs and sports. Balancing the need for fundraising with the desire to not over ask our families, this event allowed these clubs and sports to raise money for their causes and altogether, the clubs and sports raised \$2135.
- More than \$15,000 was raised to support the mission and vision of LCS.

Fundraising requests for the months of March, April and May were as follows:

- \$400 for high school transition night appetizers and dinner
- \$910 for Handwriting without Tears training for 3 staff members
- \$200 for snacks for middle school and high school students participating in CMAS/PARCC testing.
- \$150 for drinks and cake for LCS' Senior Graduation Ceremony and celebration
- \$233 for buses for the 3rd grade field trip
- \$300 for the high school celebration on May 19th
