

Curriculum Graduation Requirements Policy

LCS requires 25 credits for graduation, spread out upon the course requirements detailed below. However, students may elect to follow the advanced requiring 28.5 credits.

The Principal, or a designee, will review the transcripts of students transferring to LCS to determine which requirements have been met and what further courses are needed to graduate.

Students must receive a passing mark on their senior thesis in order to graduate

All completed coursework in 9th-12th grades appears on the student's high school transcript and is used to calculate the student's grade point average. A passing grade in a course signifies completion of the content standards delineated for that course. In order to participate in the graduation ceremony, the required credits must be satisfactorily completed before the date of

graduation. The diploma is that of LCS and the District.

At LCS a majority of student coursework is in required subjects that develop a core knowledge of the liberal arts and sciences.

Approval of Courses Taken Outside of High School

In order to obtain credit towards the LCS graduation requirements, prior approval must be obtained from LCS Administration of all High School courses taken outside of LCS (i.e.- Thompson Online, BYU).

Part-time Student Graduation

Students who are enrolled part-time at LCS will be able to take part in commencement ceremonies with their classmates but will receive a diploma from their homeschooling or other program noting supplementation by LCS. Their diploma is not an LCS diploma.
